Jesus was punished...

That we might be forgiven

Jesus was wounded...

That we might be healed

Jesus was made sin with our sinfulness...

That we might be made righteous with His righteousness

Jesus Died our death...

That we might receive His life

Jesus endured our poverty...

That we might share His abundance

That we might share His glory

That we might have His acceptance with the Father

Jesus was made a curse...

That we might enter into the blessing

Jesus was cut off by death...

That we might be joined to God eternally

Our old man was put to death in Him...

That the new man might come to life in us

Our old man was put to death in Him...

That the new man might come to life in us

When the Lord Jesus was crucified, He accomplished a two-fold work on the cross.

1. To save people from the penalty of sin
2. To save people from the power of sin

Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

- The penalty of sin is death, it is spending eternity without God.

2 Peter 3:9 “The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.”

To save people from the power of sin

Galatians 2:20 “I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.”

- Christ lives in me!
- I live my life by faith in the Son of God!
- Jesus loved me and gave himself for me!

We died with Christ.

Romans 6:3 “Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?”

Romans 6:5 “For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection,”

Romans 6:8 “Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him,”

Our old man was crucified with Jesus

And in Romans 6:6 “**knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin.**”

- Greek grammatical tense - “was crucified with him once for all.”
- The body of sin = the old man or adamic nature
- The purpose is so that we will no longer be slaves to sin.

Romans 6:17-18 “But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance. You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.”

You are dead to sin and alive to God

Romans 6:10-11 “When Jesus died, he took sin down with him, but alive he brings God down to us. From now on, think of it this way: Sin speaks a dead language that means nothing to you; God speaks your mother tongue, and you hang on every word. You are dead to sin and alive to God. That's what Jesus did.”

Paul wrote in Romans 6:14 that sin shall not have dominion over you for you are not under law, but under grace.

New Creation in Christ

2 Corinthians 5:17 “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.”

Romans 8:10-11 “And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you.”

Jesus was made a curse...

That we might enter into the blessing

Galatians 3:13-14 Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree”), that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

- We have been redeemed with the blood of Jesus Christ.

Isaiah 53:4-6 “Surely, he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all”.

Jesus bore our shame...

That we might share His glory

Hebrews 12:1-2 Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, **looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.**
